Snapshot of State COVID Operation and Masking Orders

As more cities, states and counties issue and revise emergency orders to stop the spread of COVID-19, the International Sign Association is working to help sign, graphics and visual communications companies nationwide assess and understand the implications of these orders and emphasize the essential role of our industry.

The following resource is intended as a snapshot to help navigate this rapidly-changing environment. Please consult with regulators within the appropriate jurisdiction and your own stakeholders including legal counsel before making a determination on how to best proceed with your company's operations.

Alabama

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. A state mask order took effect July 16 and remains in force until at least July 31, when Gov. Kay Ivey will decide whether to extend it. Children age 6 and under are exempt.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No

Current Executive Order Status: Safer at Home https://governor.alabama.gov/assets/2020/07/GKI_Health-Order-Update_Aug_31_Vertical.pdf Employers are required to practice mitigation policies including social distancing and handwashing; face coverings are only required for businesses where staff come into close contact with customers.

Alaska

Statewide Mask Order: No.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. Effective August 11, Health Mandate 010 establishes requirements for all travelers arriving from another state or country. All travelers must test within 72 hours before departure, submit a self-isolation plan, strictly social distance for 14 days or until receiving two negative test results.

These letters must include travel plans and confirm that the traveler is following the employer’s Community Workforce Protect Plan on file with the state that includes testing and/or quarantine provisions.”**)

Current Executive Order Status: Phase 3/4 Reopen Responsibly. On May 22, Alaska entered the third phase of its economic reopening which permits all businesses, houses of worship and libraries to reopen, and allows for recreational and sporting activities to open.

Arizona

Statewide Mask Order: No. Masks are required for employees and customers of barbers and cosmetologists. They are recommended in other circumstances. Several major counties (Maricopa, Pima, Coconino, Santa Cruz, Yuma) have implemented countywide requirements (#MaskUpAZ). The Arizona Department of Health Services has issued an updated guidance allowing local governments to implement mask and face covering policies and allowing local authorities to tailor mitigation efforts specific to the local public health need

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No. The 14-day quarantine requirement for out-of-state travelers was rescinded on May 12.

Current Executive Order Status: “Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected” Currently the state of Arizona is open for essential business and some limitations on nonessential such as restaurants and retails, the policy will be under continuous review for extension or rescission every two weeks. The order opened several nonessential businesses with direct guidelines from the Arizona Department of Public Health.

Arkansas

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Effective July 20, 2020, Governor Asa Hutchinson has issued a mandatory mask mandate for residents and visitors in Arkansas. Everyone will be required to wear masks in public spaces to help reduce the spread of COVID-19. The order exempts children under the age of 10.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No. Effective June 15, 2020, there is now no quarantine requirement for travelers entering Arkansas based on the location they traveled from. This includes both domestic and international travel.

Current Executive Order Status: Arkansas never shut down public activities, so no reopening plan was announced or implemented.

California

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. On June 18, Gov. Newsome issued an order for all Californians to wear face coverings while in public or high-risk settings, including when shopping, taking public transit or seeking medical care. The state mandate exempts children 2 years old and younger, and people with a medical, mental health or developmental disability that prevents them from wearing a face covering. Face coverings also are not required for

the hearing impaired, or those communicating with them, or for workers whose health may be put at risk or who may need to temporarily remove a mask to perform a task or service.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Phase 2 Resilience Roadmap

California now is in early **Stage 2**, where retail, related logistics and manufacturing, office workplaces, limited personal services, outdoor museums, child care, and essential businesses can open with modifications.

Stage 2 expansion will be phased in gradually. Some communities may move through Stage 2 faster if able to show greater progress. Counties that have met the readiness criteria and worked with the California Department of Public Health can open more workplaces as outlined on the County Variance page.

Colorado

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Jared Polis' order requires Coloradans over the age of 10 to wear face coverings in indoor public spaces. It took effect July 17 and will be in force for at least 30 days. Counties may be able to opt out if they meet state benchmarks for declining caseloads and several other public health criteria.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Level 2: Safer at Home and in the Vast, Great Outdoor Colorado is currently operating under a phased reopening plan that started on May 1.

Connecticut

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Ned Lamont's mask order issued April 17 remains in force. It requires a mask or face covering for "any person in a public place in Connecticut who is unable to or does not maintain a safe social distance of approximately six feet from every other person." It does not cover children under age 2, or children generally when they are in a child-care setting.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. On June 24, the Governors of Connecticut, New York, and New Jersey announced that visitors from states with high coronavirus infection rates must self-quarantine for 14 days on arrival. As of August 4, 36 states are affected, including neighboring Rhode Island.

Delaware

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Governor John Carney issued a modified State of Emergency declaration that requires Delawareans to wear face coverings in public settings, including in grocery stores, convenience stores, pharmacies, doctor's offices, and on public transportation.

Statewide Travel Restriction: No, the out-of-state self-quarantine ended on June 1, 2020. Those traveling to Delaware from out of state no longer need to self-quarantine for 14 days upon arrival.

Current Executive Order Status: Delaware's Economic Reopening Phase 2

District of Columbia

Citywide Mask Order: Yes. Under the Mayor's Order, people must wear a mask when they leave their homes if they are likely to come into contact with another person for more than a fleeting moment. Exceptions are listed including: children under the age of three; a person who is in an enclosed office that no one else is allowed to enter; a person who is actively eating or drinking; and a person who is engaged in vigorous outdoor exercise and is maintaining social distance of at least six feet from other people.

Citywide Travel Restriction: Yes. Self-quarantine required for 14 days for non-essential travel from 29 higher risk states. All travel to DC or VA or for essential activities is exempt.

Florida

Statewide Mask Order: No. Florida recommends but does not require face coverings for the general public. Several cities and large counties, including Miami-Dade, Palm Beach and Hillsborough (which includes Tampa), have mask requirements.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. Travelers and residents arriving from New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut are required to self-quarantine for 14 days upon arrival, or the duration of their trip, whichever is shorter.

Current Executive Order Status: Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step. Phase 2. June 5, Florida entered Phase 2 of “Safe. Smart. Step-by-Step” plan with a reopened economy. Under the most recent order, local municipalities may implement their own stay at home order as they deem appropriate for their communities but shall follow the critical infrastructure workforce guidance.

Georgia

Statewide Mask Order: No.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: None with a significant impact on manufacturing or construction businesses.

Hawaii

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. David Ige's COVID-19 emergency proclamation requires face covering for customers at or waiting to enter a place of business and for employees who have contact with customers or goods.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. There is a mandatory self-quarantine requirement for all individuals arriving in Hawaii, for 14 days or the duration of the visit, whichever is shorter.

Current Executive Order Status: Part 2. Beyond Recovery: Reopening

Beginning June 1, Hawaii transitioned to Part 2: Re-opening of the Beyond Recovery: Reopening Hawai'i, four part plan. Manufacturing is open with social distancing and safe practices. Businesses in operation must practice social

distancing, maintain separate operating hours for high-risk populations and make “readily available” hand sanitizers and sanitizing products.

Idaho

Statewide Mask Order: No.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Rebound Idaho Stage 4: Stay Healthy “Idaho’s response to COVID-19 is now primarily local or regional in nature.”

Illinois

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Anyone who is over the age of 2 and medically able to wear a mask must do so in a public place when unable to maintain 6-foot distancing.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No. The Illinois Department of Public Health is asking individuals arriving in the state from a country with a Level 3 Travel Health Notice from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to self-quarantine for 14 days. While there aren’t other statewide travel restrictions in place in Illinois, *its largest city—Chicago—has a travel order mandating visitors from states experiencing a surge in COVID-19 cases self-quarantine upon arrival.* There are currently 18 states the city requires a quarantine from: Alabama, Arkansas, Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Idaho, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, Nevada, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Utah. The Chicago Department of Public Health says that anyone entering the city from a state on the list must self-quarantine “for a 14-day period from the time of last contact within the identified state.” The list is reviewed and updated by officials each week.

Current Executive Order Status: Phase 4 Restore Illinois

Indiana

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Eric Holcomb's order requiring Hoosiers age 8 and up to mask themselves in most public settings took effect July 27 and will run through at least Aug. 26. It also sets detailed mask requirements for reopening schools, with students in grades 3-12 and all adults required to cover their faces when on school property, until further notice.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Indiana's Back on Track Stage 4.5

Manufacturing was permitted in Phase 2 and "Guidelines for Manufacturing" were provided with health and safety protocols regarding social distancing, employee checks and overall safety.

Iowa

Statewide Mask Order: No. State officials have encouraged mask use. Gov. Kim Reynolds' emergency order, most recently updated June 25, does not mention face coverings among its public health provisions. She has said cities and counties do not have the authority to enact mask mandates.

Statewide Travel Restrictions:No

Current Executive Order Status: Iowa had not ever imposed a stay at home order throughout the COVID-19 outbreak, though Governor Reynolds imposed a state of emergency and several business restrictions largely applying to in-person retail businesses.

Kansas

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Laura Kelly issued an executive order July 2 requiring face covering in public. It applies to most people over the age of 5. *However, a state law passed in June allows Kansas counties to opt out of gubernatorial health directives, and most are not following the mask order.*

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. Travelers from Florida and Arizona must quarantine for 14 days upon arriving in the state

Current Executive Order Status: Reopen Kansas Phase 3 Gov. Kelly announced the state moved to Phase 3 of the Reopening Kansas plan starting June 8. Kentucky

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Andy Beshear's July 9 executive order requires face covering for people "in situations that represent a high risk of COVID-19 transmission," including most public settings. It took effect July 10 and will last at least 30 days. Children age 5 and under are exempt.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. The Kentucky Department of Public Health issued a travel advisory that recommends a 14- day self-quarantine for travelers who went to any of eight states (AL, AZ, FL, GA, ID, NV, SC, TX) that were reporting a positive coronavirus testing rate equal to or greater than 15%. The advisory also included Mississippi, which was quickly approaching a positive testing rate of 15%, and the Territory of Puerto Rico.

Louisiana

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. The statewide mask mandate, which will allow for parishes without high COVID-19 incidence to opt out if they choose, went into effect July 13. As of July 11, "employees that deal with the public MUST wear face masks when a business is open, and all businesses must practice social distancing. All members of the public must wear a mask or cloth face covering when they are in public and interacting with members outside of their households."

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No

Maine

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Large retail businesses, restaurants, outdoor bars, tasting rooms, and lodging establishments in Maine's more populous cities now required to enforce mask mandate.

Statewide Travel Restriction: Yes. Maine has three options for visitors from other states: 1) getting a recent negative COVID-19 test; 2) maintaining compliance with a [14-day quarantine](#) upon arrival in Maine; 3) being exempted if from CT, NH, NJ, NY, VT.

Current Executive Order Status: Restarting Maine Stage 3 <https://www.maine.gov/covid19/restartingmaine>

Maryland

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. All Marylanders over the age of five are required to wear face coverings in the public spaces of all businesses across the state. Face coverings will also be required in outdoor public areas, whenever it is not possible to maintain physical distancing. The expanded order continues to provide certain exceptions, including for medical conditions.

Statewide Travel Restriction: Yes. Although essential workers (including sign industry) are exempt for work-related travel and for any travel to DC or VA, all interstate travelers should get tested within 72 hrs of arrival. Interstate travelers from AL, AZ, FL, GA, ID, LA, NE, SC, TX should get tested **AND** remain self-quarantined until negative result.

Current Executive Order Status: Maryland Strong Roadmap to Recovery Stage 2

Massachusetts

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. On May 1, Governor Baker issued an Executive Order requiring the wearing of face masks in public in situations where social distancing is not possible.

Statewide Travel Restriction: Yes. All visitors entering Massachusetts, including returning residents, who do not meet an exemption, are required to Complete the Massachusetts Travel Form prior to arrival, unless visiting from a lower-risk state designated by the Department of Public Health. Visitors also must quarantine for 14 days or

produce a negative COVID-19 test result that has been administered up to 72-hours prior to your arrival in Massachusetts. If a COVID-19 test result has not been received prior to arrival, visitors, and residents must quarantine until they receive a negative test result.

Michigan

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. People over age 4 are required to mask up in any indoor public space and in “crowded outdoor spaces,” Gov. Gretchen Whitmer's office announced July 10. Her order also requires businesses to refuse entry or service to people who refuse to wear a face covering, with limited exceptions.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Minnesota

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Tim Walz’s mask order took effect July 25, superseding a prior mandate that applied to employees at stores, restaurants and other consumer-facing businesses. Children age 5 and under are exempt. People are not required to wear a mask when working alone in an office or cubicle with walls above face height when social distancing is maintained but must keep one handy for interacting with others. Additionally, workers are required to wear a face covering when working outdoors in situations where social distancing cannot be maintained.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Stay Safe Phase 3 Minnesota began operating on June 10 in Phase 3 Non-critical businesses to safely reopen as well as federal CISA essential business to expand operations.

Mississippi

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Tate Reeves issued an August 4 order requiring face coverings for all Mississippians in schools, businesses and indoor public spaces, and in outdoor public spaces where consistent social distancing is not possible.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Missouri

Statewide Mask Order: No. The state Department of Health and Senior Services recommends wearing a face covering in public. Gov. Mike Parson has said he does not intend to implement a statewide requirement. Several cities and counties have enacted mask mandates, including Kansas City and St. Louis.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Show Me Strong Recovery Phase 2 (<https://showmestrong.mo.gov/>)

Montana

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. In counties where there are four or more confirmed cases, Gov. Bullock has directed face coverings be worn in indoor spaces open to the public and for certain organized outdoor activities. Face coverings are required only for employees and contractors in public-facing work spaces. And face coverings are not required for persons having a medical condition precluding the safe wearing of a face covering.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Reopening Montana Phase 2

Statewide Mask Order: No.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No. International Travelers should self-quarantine and self-monitor for 14-days

Current Executive Order Status: Directed Health Measures, Phase 3 and 4 (<http://dhhs.ne.gov/Pages/COVID-19-Directed-Health-Measures.aspx>)

Nevada

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Gov. Steve Sisolak instituted a mandatory face-covering policy on June 24, requiring most people over age 9 to wear a mask “in any public space.”

Statewide Travel Restrictions: No.

Current Executive Order Status: Nevada United: Roadmap to Recovery Phase 2

Nevada is currently operating under Phase Two of the Nevada United: Roadmap to Recovery Plan through June 30, allowing for 50% limited in store capacity for non-essential businesses such as restaurants and retail businesses reopening under this phase

New Hampshire

Statewide Mask Order: No. Retail, restaurant, golf course, and personal care services employees *must* wear cloth face coverings at all times when in the retail facility and in public locations or shared staff areas (e.g. break rooms), even if other individuals are not immediately present. Employees of other essential businesses and organizations and those that are re-opening all or a portion of their operations are strongly *recommended* to wear a cloth face covering while at work and in potential close contact with others.

Statewide Travel Restrictions: Yes. Those traveling to New Hampshire from non-New England states for an extended period of time are asked to self-quarantine for a two-week period. But the two week self-quarantine has been lifted for those traveling to New Hampshire from surrounding New England States (Maine, Vermont, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island).

New Jersey

Statewide Mask Order: Yes. Expanded order requires individuals to wear face coverings in outdoor public spaces when it is not practicable to socially distance and keep a six-foot distance from others, except where doing so would inhibit that individual's health, where the individual is under two years of age, or in situations where individuals cannot feasibly wear a face covering, such as when eating or drinking at outdoor dining areas. The Order also reiterates New Jersey's policy of requiring face coverings in indoor spaces that are accessible to members of the public, such as retail, recreational, and entertainment businesses, areas of government buildings open to the public, and mass transit buses, trains, and stations, again with exceptions for health reasons and children under two.

Current Executive Order Status: "Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected" Currently the state of Arizona is open for essential business and some limitations on nonessential such as restaurants and retails, the policy will be under continuous review for extension or rescission every two weeks.
